



# Transportation

## Roads, rail, air, water -- Wapakoneta is ready to help you deliver!

Located at the intersection of Interstate 75 and US 33, Wapakoneta is well positioned to take full advantage of Ohio's transportation advantages. Midway between Chicago, Cleveland, and Cincinnati, Wapakoneta is within a days drive of 63% of U.S. manufacturing facilities and 80% of U.S. corporate headquarters. Sixty percent of the U.S. population and 50% of the Canadian population lives within 600 miles of Wapakoneta. This easy access to profitable markets will lower your cost of doing business.

## Highway Transportation

### Interstate 75 @ US 33

Interstate 75 runs north-south through the eastern portion of Wapakoneta. There are three I-75 interchanges within the City. Wapakoneta's 700-acre West Central Ohio Industrial Center literally occupies the southwest quadrant of the I-75 and US 33 interchange. Interstate 75 is one of North America's primary north-south highways. An estimated 21 million people pass through Wapakoneta each year. Wapakoneta is also positioned less than 60 minutes from I-70 near Dayton, I-80 near Toledo, and US 30 near Findlay. US 33 runs east-west, linking Wapakoneta with Columbus and southeastern Ohio/West Virginia. This highway access provides major benefits for your company for commerce with easy travel possible from any market in or outside of Ohio.

# Rail Transportation

## **CSX Transportation, Inc.**

Wapakoneta's 700-acre West Central Ohio Industrial Center is adjacent to the CSX mainline rail. The new 470-acre Ohio Job Ready Site at Wapakoneta has direct rail access. Ohio has the fourth-highest rail freight traffic in the country. Thirty-six freight railroads, with 5,800 miles of track, cover the state. Wapakoneta is served by CSX Transportation's mainline rail in western Ohio. CSX operates the largest railroad in the eastern U.S. with a 21,000-mile rail network linking commercial markets in 23 states and two Canadian provinces. CSX Corporation provides rail, intermodal, and rail-to-truck transload services that are among the nation's leading transportation companies, connecting more than 70 river, ocean, and lake ports, as well as more than 200 short line railroads.

CSX Intermodal operates 47 intermodal terminals throughout its rail system serving your company from origin to destination with its own truck and terminal operations plus a dedicated container fleet. Connecting more than 75% of the U.S. population, CSX Intermodal offers access to most major U.S. markets and ports. Wapakoneta is served by intermodal terminals near Columbus and Cincinnati, Ohio and Detroit, Michigan and the new Northwest Intermodal Terminal in North Baltimore, OH. The 500 acre site in North Baltimore is hailed for its use of cutting-edge technology and green designs, including ultra-efficient electric cranes that lower emissions, optical scanners that reduce truck idle times, and automated car tracking technologies and remote switches that increase operational efficiency. CSX has invested \$175 million in the facility that employees more than 200, will service 800 trains per week, and handle an estimated 2 million containers annually.

## **Dayton International Airport**

60 miles south of Wapakoneta on Interstate 75

## **Neil Armstrong General Aviation Airport**

7 miles west of Wapakoneta on SR 219

Auglaize County's Neil Armstrong Airport is one of Ohio's best county general aviation airports. Named for Neil Armstrong, our native son and first person to walk on the moon, the airport handles a high volume of air freight and corporate travelers. It has a 5,000-foot long by 100-foot wide runway with precision instrument landing systems. It is capable of accommodating any size corporate aircraft. A number of our local industrial companies maintain hangers for their corporate jets adjacent to the runway. This provides convenient access for domestic and international flights from the Armstrong Airport. The airport averages 27 flights daily and more than 350 tons of airfreight annually.

## **Air Cargo Hubs**

Three air cargo hubs are also a critical component of Ohio's air transport network. Located at Rickenbacker (Columbus), Toledo Express, and Wilmington, Ohio, these intermodal transport opportunities provide seamless air-to-rail, air-to-highway, and air-to-water connectivity. Wapakoneta is located within 60-90 minutes of all three Ohio air cargo hubs.

# Water Transportation

## Ohio's Water Ports

Nine ports on Lake Erie and 16 terminals along the Ohio River rank Ohio the fourth-largest maritime state by tonnage moved. Because Ohio Port Authorities frequently offer both water and air transport, Ohio's maritime system proves a critical advantage in product transport. Wapakoneta is located about midway between the Port of Toledo on Lake Erie and numerous terminals on the Ohio River near Cincinnati. Interstate 75 provides a direct link between both maritime options.

## Port of Toledo

60 miles north of Wapakoneta on Interstate 75

The Port of Toledo, located at the confluence of the Maumee River and Lake Erie, links producers and consumer to domestic and international markets. With nearly seven miles of seaway draft waterfront and integrated access to rail, trucking, and air transport, the Port of Toledo is one of the busiest and most diverse transportation centers on the Great Lakes.

The Port of Toledo's Overseas Cargo Center provides 150 acres of ample warehouse and open storage along nearly one mile of straight-line wharf. It is served by gantry cranes along the entire wharf. Ships from throughout the world discharge and load the most diverse cargos of all the Great Lakes ports.
